SCHEDULING ORDER

At a status conference held today, January 21, 2011, the parties conferred and discussed with the court the remaining issues that must be resolved before the court may enter final judgment in this case. Those issues appear to be: (1) the amount of money involved in the claim delineated in the opinion and order issued on December 21, 2010, brought forward to January 1, 2011, (2) the persons who qualify as proper claimants in this case, and (3) the role, if any, of the 1863 Acts. In light of the discussions held at today's conference, the court adopts the following schedule for the eventual entry of final judgment in this case:

Filing of stipulations and documentation by both parties that bear on the three issues listed above	February 25, 2011
Plaintiffs' Motions for summary judgment	March 18, 2011
Defendant's and any other party's response to plaintiffs' motions, plus any cross-motions	April 15, 2011
Plaintiffs' replies and any responses to any cross-motions	April 29, 2011
Defendant's and any other party's replies in support of any cross-motions	May 11, 2011

Hearing on all outstanding motions

May 13, 2011 at 10:00 a.m.

This schedule shall govern any filings the parties may submit regarding both the issue of qualified claimants and the role of the 1863 Acts. Accordingly, all motions to amend complaints, including amendments to incorporate claims regarding the 1863 Acts, must be filed on or before March 18, 2011.

The hearing scheduled for May 13, 2011 shall be held at the court in Washington, D.C. The particular courtroom to be used will be listed in the lobby of the courthouse on the day of the proceeding.

Pending before the court as well is plaintiffs' motion for an award of interim and final attorney fees, for separate determination of liability, and for a briefing schedule on plaintiffs' motion, filed January 19, 2011. At the conference held today, the government requested an extension of three days, from January 22, 2011 to January 25, 2011, within which to file its response to plaintiffs' motion. For good cause shown, the government's request is GRANTED. The government shall file its response to plaintiffs' motion on or before January 25, 2011.

It is so ORDERED.
